Jude 5 | Now I want to remind you, although you once fully knew it

WHAT **YOU** KNEW FULLY.

- 1. You are a sinner.
- 2. You need a Lord and Savior (Leader of your life and forgiver of your sins)
- 3. Jesus is the only fit Lord and Savior

Jude 19 | It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit.

Jude 5 | ...that Jesus, who saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe.

Numbers 14:35 | I, the Lord, have spoken. Surely this will I do to all this wicked congregation who are gathered together against me: in this wilderness they shall come to a full end, and there they shall die.

1 John 2:19 | They went out from us, but they were not of us...

Jude 6 | And the angels who did not stay within their own position of authority, but left their proper dwelling, he has kept in eternal chains under gloomy darkness until the judgment of the great day

- Other Text // Isaiah 14:12-21 // Ezekiel 28:12-19
 - Jude 6 parallel text 2 Peter 2:4

2 Peter 2:4 | For if God did not spare angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to chains of gloomy darkness to be kept until the judgment;

Jude 7 | just as Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding cities, which likewise indulged in sexual immorality and pursued unnatural desire, serve as an example by undergoing a punishment of eternal fire.

Ezekiel 16:49 | Behold, this was the guilt of your sister Sodom: she and her daughters had pride, excess of food, and prosperous ease, but did not aid the poor and needy

Jude 8 | Yet in like manner these people also, relying on their dreams, defile the flesh, reject authority, and blaspheme the glorious ones.

Jude 9 | But when the archangel Michael, contending with the devil, was disputing about the body of Moses, he did not presume to pronounce a blasphemous judgment, but said, "The Lord rebuke you."

**Resource on Assumption on Moses – <u>https://www.gotquestions.org/Assumption-of-Moses.html</u> ... Jude did not intend to put a canonical stamp on the Assumption of Moses simply because he cited it. He viewed this story as true or helpful, or he believed it illustrated the truth he desired to teach as Paul does in Acts 17 with non-Christian poets.

Jude 10-11 | 10 But these people blaspheme all that they do not understand, and they are destroyed by all that they, like unreasoning animals, understand instinctively 11 Woe to them! For they walked in the way of Cain and abandoned themselves for the sake of gain to Balaam's error and perished in Korah's rebellion.

Jude 12-13 | 12 These are hidden reefs at your love feasts, as they feast with you without fear, shepherds feeding themselves; waterless clouds, swept along by winds; fruitless trees in late autumn, twice dead, uprooted; 13 wild waves of the sea, casting up the foam of their own shame; wandering stars, for whom the gloom of utter darkness has been reserved forever.

Jude 14-15 | 14 It was also about these that Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied, saying, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of his holy ones, 15 to execute judgment on all and to convict all the ungodly of all their deeds of ungodliness that they have committed in such an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things that ungodly sinners have spoken against him."

Just like other literature, it has true statements in it. But that does not mean the entire work is inspired like the 66 Books of the Bible are inspired by God.
